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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Kittur Rani Channamma Education Society's A Brief Profile Towards the end of nineteen hundred sixties, a group of elites in Bail hongal and Bailhongal Taluka thought of ways they could participate in a noble task of extending higher educational facilities to the people of this region which was educationally and socially backward. This group decided to form an educational society and formed one such in 1968 and named it after Rani Channamma as Kittur Rani Channamma Education Society, Bailhongal. Shri S.R.Kanti Hon'ble Minister for Law and Parliamentary Affairs, the then Mysore Govt. was the Founder President, under whose able guidance, the society started functioning. The great seers - His Holiness Sri.Sri. Duradundeshwar Mahant Swamiji of Murgod and His Holiness Sri. Sri. Shivabasava Maha Swamiji of Naganur extended their benevolent blessings for the steady growth of the society. People at large enthusiastically came forward with helping hand to develop this society. Shrimanth B.B.Inamadar along with Shrimanth Devendrappa Linganagouda Inamadar and his sons of Khodanpur jointly donated acres of prime land to K.R.C.E.Society. Public institutions of this area also extended their co-operation and full support to the society in carrying out its noble mission. Town Municipality of Bailhongal leased part of its high school building to run the college; Agriculture Produce Market Committee and Taluka Development Board have generously contributed to the cause of society. An immense public contribution in the form of donations is worth remembering. As a first endeavour, K.R.C.E.Society established Arts and Science College at Bailhongal in the year 1968. For fulfilling the rigorous task generous donations were collected from the public. Mention must be made of generous donations given by Sri G.V.Deshnur, an industrialist, Sri S.V.Sadhunavar, landlord of Amatur and Shri Sankanagoudaru S.Patil of Devalapur. Hence, the college is renamed as G.G.Deshnur Arts, B.M. Patil Commerce as S.V.Sadhunavar Science College, Bailhogal. VII After the establishment of Arts and Science College, the Society took great paints to recruit well-qualified staff and to make available all possible facilities to the students. Within a few years G.G.Deshnur Arts, B.M. Patil Commerce and S.V.Sadhunavar Science College gained enormous goodwill as provider of quality education and the enrolment of students increased considerably. In the year 1980 college was shifted to the new campus by the side of Bailhongal- Belgaum road within as easy reach of Bailhongal Town precincts. The Government at nominal rate contributed part of this land. Sri. Veerendra Patil, Hon'ble Chief Minister the then Mysore Govt., laid the foundation stone for the construction of college building. The Arts, Commerce and Science College is the premier institution that imparted quality education to the aspirants. Many new course were introduced for the benefit of students of this region. Expansion activities gained momentum during 1980's and under able and exemplary leadership of Shri S.H.Koujalagi Ex-MP and The Chairman of the Society. Dr. Vishwanath Patil assumed of the chairman in the year 2007. Under his leadership various institutions are functioning to impart different event branches of knowledge.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The college has a clear vision, mission, goals and objectives. Institution is affiliated to Rani Channamma University, Belagavi and it follows the curriculum designed by the university. The Institution imparts instructions at undergraduate courses in accordance with semester whereas PG in Commerce has a choice based credit system. The institution adopted New Education Policy (NEP) from 2021-22. Four Certificate Courses are offered to the students. Curricular, Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities help students to improve personality development, communication skills, leadership qualities and team spirit. Students are sensitized to human values, ethics gender, cultural and environmental values. NSS / NCC / Red Cross / Scouts & Guides etc., infuse the spirit of inquiry, sacrifice and community services. The faculty is well experienced, seven faculties are on the Board of Studies and Board of Examiners. Some of them were involved in designing curriculum of the affiliated university and other autonomous colleges. The placement cell organized various programmes. Skill development activities to increase employability of the students. Special lecture organized by some departments. Students motivated to undertake project work, study tour, industrial visit, filed visit etc. The institution collects feed-back from various stakeholders and analysis for further improvement and implementation.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The college followed admission process based on Government rules and norms. It gives equal opportunity to all the sections such as SC/ST, OBC, Women, Minority, Differently abled.

The institute offers three Under Graduate and a Post Graduate Programmes. As per requirement of the teaching faculty, it appoints Government and Management faculties. The guidelines and procedures given by the UGC, University, State Government and the Management are followed. The college has student centric practices such as orientation, study tours, industrial visits and projects. The Institution offered with endowment cash prizes. Institution promoted the use of ICT based teaching learning process through internet. Presently 07 teachers are qualified with Ph.D. and others are qualified with M.Phil., NET & SLET. Institution affiliated to Rani Channamma University, Belagavi and as per university we follows Internal Assessment such as first test, home assignment, second test, projects, seminars etc. University conducts semester theory and practical exams as per the schedule. The result is sent to the student portal and same is maintained in the institution. Institution guides to students for re-valuation, photo copy of answer scripts, re-totaling. Teachers and students are informed regarding programme outcomes and course outcomes by the college. The students are motivated to go for higher education. At the end of the even semester students satisfaction survey is conducted.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Research is the back bone of higher education. Teaching and research are the two faces of the same coin. To develop the quest of inquiry and promote research culture among the faculty and students the institution has initiated various measures.

The institution encourages and support faculty and students writing and publication of research articles. Total 21 articles of the faculty members published articles in national / international / peer reviewed journals. Total 22 articles published as a books / book chapter.

Our students are also actively involved in undertaking research projects. Three of the faculty members have registered for Ph.D. and work is under progress.

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The institution has rich and long experienced research guides Dr. Y.G. Baligatti, and Dr. S.M. Lokapur. They are the recognized research guides of Rani Channamma University, Belagavi and 08 students awarded with Ph.D.

Institution conducted one national level student seminar and a webinar. Department of Science and Technology Karnataka State Dharwad in association with our institution Dharwad Zonal Level Science Exhibition is conducted.

NCC / NSS / YRC / Scouts & Guides units of our institution conducted the 98 extension and outreach activities which have benefited the community. State level prize won by Scouts & Guides student.

Our college has 09 MOUs and collaborations with different organizations. It provides an opportunity to access the practical knowledge from industry, to render community service and to share research knowledge to our students.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college has good infrastructure facilities for teaching, learning and evaluation process. It is set on 15.29 acres of land which is free from pollution. There are 17 lecture halls, 2 seminar halls, 10 well equipped laboratories, one botanical garden including shade garden, one animal museum. Along with a playground there is a multi gym facility and yoga hall.

NCC, NSS, Scouts & Guides, Red Cross units, Cultural Association and Women's Empowerment Cells have separate well equipped rooms. These cells help to inculcate values, discipline, service, curricular and co-curricular activities. Ladies langue facility is available.

Institution has ladies hostel is constructed under XI Plan period of UGC. There is one Boys hostel and one Ladies hostel together can accommodate 54 students with necessary facilities.

Placement cell works to enhance student employment opportunities by facilitating on campus selection events. Suggestion boxes are kept in library, office and near to staff room.

SWO & Grievance Redressal cell helped the students if they face any problems. Hygienic Canteen and Bank facilities are available on the campus premises. CC TV surveillance is available for the security purpose.

The Library having an area of 4687 sq. ft. with complete automation and has internet browsing & reprography facilities. Library has Advisory committee with Principal as a President, looks and monitors the library activities.

There is a periodic up gradation of IT infrastructure & associated facilities every year to meet the needs of the students.

Institution has 08 smart boards / projectors and 46 Computers with 10 Mbps internet facility. Many faculty utilizing IT facility on the needy basis. The faculty sending study materials through What's app, E-mail etc. Wi-Fi facility is available on the campus. Sufficient provision is made for purchase of books, upgradation, maintenance of the computers and other accessories. Care has been taken to maintain all sensitive equipment's.

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Management is extending its full support in providing and maintenance of the infrastructure of the institution.

Student Support and Progression

With the help of updated prospectus students are made familiar with various types of scholarships and college amenities. Students from SC/ST, OBC, Minority and Weaker Section are supported with government and non-government scholarships.

1698 students are benefited by scholarship of Rs. 57,73,793-00 under government and non government schemes.

Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular, extracurricular activities and sports activities. Placement Officer and various departments organize programs on Life skill, Language and communication skills and soft skills to enhance students' skills. Exposures to students are given through study tours, industrial visits, awareness programs and science exhibitions.

College has Grievances redressal cell and anti-ragging committee. So far no issues of sexual harassment have been reported. Alumni Association contributes to the development of the institution.

The most of the students prefer to go for B.Ed. B.Com graduates of our college are helped in admission to M.Com course offered by the institution.

The institution facilitates students for Sports and Cultural activities. The sports dresses are provided to sports persons for collegiate and university level sports events. University blues, sports and cultural events achievers are felicitated by the institution. Scouts & Guides students won the state level prizes.

Our institution has registered alumni association; it participates in the holistic development of the college. The meritorious students are given cash prizes by the association. Tree plantation programmes are conducted by the association.

Bus facility is provided for the students.

Governance, Leadership and Management

To achieve vision, and mission of the college, the top management including board of management of our society, sub-committee chairman of our college and principal provide effective leadership.

After interacting with all stakeholders, strategies for effective implementation of the college plans and policies are formulated. Teachers, administrative staff, HODs, Conveners of committees and associations are take keen interest in promoting leadership among the students.

The College organizes leadership camps for the improvement of quality policies. To ensure community involvement the college organizes various programmes. The faculty members are motivated to take up research activities and 38 faculty development programmes (FDP) was attended by faculty members. The institution has

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effective welfare measures for teaching and non-teaching staff such as Health Check-up camp, covid-19 vaccination and training programmes. The employee society provides loan facilities with lower interest rate. Internal and external financial audits are regularly conducted by the institution.

Sufficient care is taken for the globalization of resources for developmental academic and administrative activities.

The college has the IQAC Cell which was established in the year 2005.

The perspective plan is prepared every year by IQAC for academic activities and additional infrastructure development. Periodically feed-back is taken from the stake holders. Findings of the feed-back are analyzed and necessary action is taken and quality policy is formulated by the principal and top management. The institution is having the future plans of installation of solar lighting, additional Bus facility, up gradation of zoology museum, introduction of new PG courses etc. Annual Quality Assurance Report is prepared by IQAC and placed before the management. After the approval from management AQAR is submitted to NAAC.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The institution has various committees such as Women Empowerment Cell, NCC, NSS, Scouts & Guides, Youth Red Cross etc, organizes different programmes regarding gender equity and sensitization programmes. The college has Grievance Redressal and Anti Sexual Harassment Cell. The college celebrates national / international programmes on gender equity and commemoration of various days.

Security guards are appointed by the institution. There are 48 CCTV cameras are installed in difference places of the college. ID cards are given to students and staff to restrict the unauthorized entries.

The institution takes care of environmental consciousness by taking various initiatives such as tree plantation, use of solar energy and optimal use of natural lights in classrooms and laboratories.

The institution has also taken necessary steps to keep the college campus clean and greenery. An effort has been made to enrich the storage of ground water in the college campus by constructing rain harvesting pond. Provision is also made for proper management of solid, liquid and e-waste. The LED bulbs are used in institution. No vehicle day is celebrated.

The institution follows Divyangajana friendly initiatives such as ramp, wheel chair, human assistance etc.

Green Audit, Energy Audit and Environmental Audits are conducted. Campus cleaning programmes conducted by NCC, NSS, Eco-club, Scouts & Guides etc. Environmental activities are practiced beyond the campus by various associations of our institution.

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	In our institution all UG & PG courses are multidisciplinary in nature. Along with this certificate courses, skill based course, (Outcome based courses +?) introduced in our college / institution. At the time of admission students are informed with open Elective Courses (OEC), Skill Enhanced Courses (SEC) and Discipline specific courses (DSC) which is offered by the affiliating University.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	New Education Policy helps students for Educational Flexibility. It will helpful for the students to get employability at any level. The will be opportunity of continuation of education for the students who left after one year, two year, etc. it will reduce the

	dropout ratio of students. The students are informed with multiple exit options in present scenario. Timely the affiliating University inform regarding individual academic bank accounts through circulars. ABC regulations will support, learning mode in which students will be allowed to even credit.
3. Skill development:	In all our courses skill development is one of the integral part of education. It will be helpful for the contribute skilled human resource to the nation. The weightage is given to introduce digital Fluency, Yoga, Communication Skills, Awareness, Physical Education Activities, Ethics, Environmental respectively, enhancing scientific temper, national integration etc. the skill based syllabi is inculcated / imbibed in NEP.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	Karnataka is the first state to adopt NEP. There is preference in local language teaching. The teaching in integrating with Socio-economic aspects and culture, science streams such as Mathematics with Laboratory teaching, Physics and Computer Science which are under the consideration of Board of Studies of Affiliating University. History syllabus is reconstructed and considered with historical touch. Archeological survey opportunity is there in History syllabus. Sociology subject is enriched with burning social issues. The importance is given by Govt. of Karnataka for regional language for all programmes as AECC (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course) as pr NEP guidelines.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	According to UGC guidelines 2019-20 the syllabus for all the courses under different programme are revised by affiliating university as per choice based credit system (CBCS). From the academic year 2021-22, the syllabi is designed and developed as per CBCS in accordance with learning outcomes based curriculum Framework (LOCF) of NEP. The course and programme outcomes are stated by the institution based on the LOCF.
6. Distance education/online education:	The teaching Fraternity were involved in teaching process by using electronic media such as online classes, google and zoom classrooms. Kittur Rani Channamma Education Society's G.G. Deshanur Arts, B.M. Patil Commerce, and S.V. Sadhunavar Science College, Bailhongal, the premier educational institution in Bailhongal, was established in 1968 with Arts and Science streams from the beginning, and a Commerce stream was added in 1981. The institution continued to provide a wide range of programmes by adding a postgraduate M.Com. course in commerce in 2014. The college authority takes advantage of being located on 15 acres of serene environment on a pollution-free campus. The institution fulfils all the norms of UGC, like 2f, 12B, etc. The institution received a B+ in the first cycle in 2004, a "B" grade and a CGPA of 2.69 in the second cycle in 2011, and a B++ and a CGPA of 2.89 in the third cycle in 2017.

Our college student, Miss Sharada G. Gadadavar, was awarded the 9th rank in Bachelor of Science at the 11th annual convocation of Rani Channamma University, Belagavi, held on March 20, 2023. Teaching and research are two sides of the same coin. The institute has initiated various measures to develop the quest for inquiry and promote a culture of research among faculty and students. IQAC motivates the faculty to undergo research activities to achieve the college's vision and mission, as a result of which two faculty members have completed their PhD degrees in 2022 and three more will complete their PhD degrees.

Dr. Y.G. Baligatti and Dr. S.M. Lokapura are recognised as research guides at Rani Channamma University, Belagavi. Five students have been awarded PhD degrees under the guidance of Dr Y.G.Baligatti and Three students have a PhD degree, and three are working under the guidance of Dr. S.M.Lokapur. At present, six faculty members have PhD degrees, and Three faculties are pursuing PhD degrees. The institute encourages faculty to participate in various conferences, seminars, workshops, and presentations of research papers; hence, our faculty members have published 21 research articles in ISSN and ISBN journals and participated in seminars, webinars, and conferences in both online and offline modes. Our institution has MOUs and research collaborations with different organizations. IQAC motivates the faculty to adopt modern technology in the teaching and learning process.

The unique feature of our institution is to take care of environmental consciousness, and hence the institution has selected tree planting as one of the best practices of college, and the students of NSS, NCC, the Red Cross Unit, Scouts and Guides, and the Alumni Association are planting the trees every year on 15 acres of available land. The institution has taken the necessary steps to keep the college campus clean and green. The rainwater harvesting pond is constructed to enrich the groundwater on campus.

The best measure of our institution's distinctiveness is how well our alumni are doing. Many former students of our college are working in different positions in the civil service, revenue, excise, police department, education, defense (Army, Air Force, and Navy), income tax, transport, social welfare, and backward class departments, multi-national companies, etc. For the encouragement of students, we sponsor endowment cash prizes, and the Alumni Association gives cash prizes of Rs 1000 to the toppers of each stream every year. With the help of an updated prospectus, students become familiar with the vision and mission of the college, admission procedures, course details, scholarships, and college amenities. Students from SC/ST, OBC, minority, and weaker

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sections are supported with state, national, and institutional scholarships.

The institution has supportive cells (NCC, NSS, Scouts & Guides, Red Cross units, the Cultural Association, and the Women Empowerment Cell) for the promotion of universal values in students. Placement Cell works to enhance student employment opportunities by facilitating on-campus and online selection events and organizing events like the Udyog Mela on December 10, 2022. SWO & Grievance Redressal cells help with other kinds of problems faced by students, if any. Canteen and bank facilities are available on the campus premises. Security on campus is enabled with guards and CCTV.
